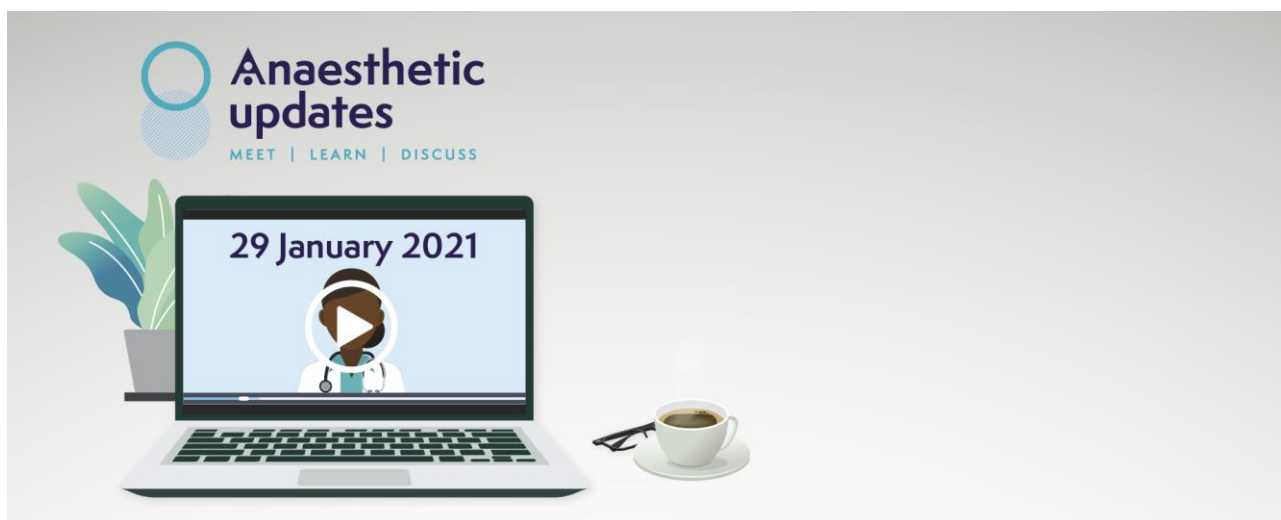


# Anaesthetic Updates: Hearts and Minds
