





Anaesthetists as Educators Programme On-line Introduction Course

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 crisis, we have developed an online version of our Introduction course, which will provide an introduction to post graduate medical education in anaesthesia. The original content of the course remains unchanged.

The course will consist of:

- Pre-recorded video lectures
- How to give a good presentation lecture delivered live
- Reading material
- Yammer chat room
- Live workshops delivered by zoom delegates must attend all four workshops
- Homework

The reading material, chat room and pre-recorded lectures will be available from **26 February 2021** and it is expected that delegates will have watched the prerecorded lectures and looked at the reading material before the live workshops on 11 March.

The course is suitable for trainees, SAS doctors and consultants who have had no previous training in teaching or medical education. The course provides the groundwork for all of the courses in the programme. The Aanaesthetists as Educators, Teaching and Training in the Workplace course, which is highly interactive, is a natural follow on workhop, which centres around your own real life experiences.

If you are intending to apply for Membership of the Academy of Medical educators, (AoME) you will need to attend both this course and the two-day Teaching and Training in the Workplace course and to complete both homeworks. Given the current situation with regard to COVID, the Academy has agreed to extend the time for completion of both courses from 24-30 months. The Teaching and Training in the Workplace course is suitable for senior trainees and SAS doctors (ST4 and above)
