Background

The Zambia Anaesthesia Development Program (ZADP) is an international partnership of Physician Anaesthetists predominantly from the UK and Zambia. ZADP was initiated in 2012 to support and enhance capacity building among physician anaesthetists in Zambia in the development of safer surgery and critical care.

ZADP works to provide teaching and mentorship to the anaesthesia trainees on the Master of Medicine program and the Specialty Training Program for Anaesthesia and Critical Care in Zambia, and to support more widely physician anaesthetists in other healthcare capacity building work.

The aim of ZADP is:

"To develop anaesthesia in Zambia by collaborating with local anaesthetists through training, improvement in safety, quality of care and research."

Part of how ZADP does this is through the support of in-country and remote volunteers.

Role description

Teaching and education	Clinical training of Zambian trainee physician anaesthetists in theatre (as appropriate for volunteer experience and competencies)
	Leading and facilitation of in situ and classroom simulation training
	Facilitation of the trainee teaching programme, examination practice and support of trainee wellbeing activities in addition to supporting departmental research and governance events in conjunction with local faculty and ZADP remote fellows
Management and Leadership	Peer mentorship of Zambian trainee physician anaesthetists
	Working with the charity in advocacy and campaigning on issues relating to global surgery and health equity
	Opportunity for wider management and leadership experience within the charity for example fundraising activities and conference planning
Quality Improvement and Research	Supporting Zambian trainee physician anaesthetists in their quality improvement and research work for example by providing QI training, project supervision or mentorship, training in data handling and presentation of results
	Data collection and analysis in support of partnership monitoring and evaluation activities
