

Vacancy: Chair of the joint Examinations Development and Assurance Group (EDAG)

The Royal College of Anaesthetists (RCoA), Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine and the Faculty of Pain Medicine seek an independent Chair for the joint Examinations Development and Assurance Group (EDAG) to provide leadership for the development of exams across our specialties.

The Examinations Development and Assurance Group (EDAG) is a new group within the College and faculties that will oversee the development of the exams and the implementation of recommendations from the two reports. We anticipate that the EDAG will meet on a monthly basis in 2023, and then on a less frequent basis such as quarterly.

The independent Chair will lead the group, working alongside a team of multi-professional experts and examiners to deliver recommendations from our examination review and implement improvements to College and faculty examinations. The EDAG will report to the College and Faculties on developments and changes to the following examinations:

Fellowship of the Royal College of Anaesthetists (FRCA)

Fellowship of the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine (FFICM)

Fellowship of the Faculty of Pain Medicine (FFPMRCA)

All three examinations are managed and supported by the Examinations Department within the RCoA.

The examinations delivered by the RCoA are approved by the General Medical Council for delivery in the UK as part of the wider curricula and training programmes in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine.

Since 2021, two reviews of our examinations have been undertaken, an internal review of the FRCA examination and an independent review of all RCoA delivered exams. Links to these reports are included below.

Internal Review of FRCA Examinations (2020-2022)

Over the past 18 months, the College conducted a review of the FRCA examination; a summative, nationally standardised assessment in the training programme, integral to patient safety. Focusing on best practice, the review examined the underlying principles, structure and mode of the examination, which had not been fundamentally reviewed in the College for over 10 years.

The report on the FRCA Internal Examinations Review was published on 11 January 2023.

Independent review of RCoA delivered examinations (2021-2022)

The College commissioned an independent review of the FRCA, FFICM and FPMRCA examinations and the delivery infrastructure for the improved long-term utility and sustainability of the examinations. The review produced a report and a set of recommendations for the three examinations that will need to be prioritised and actioned.

<u>This report</u> was published on the 16 February 2023 with an executive summary linking both internal and independent reports.

Role of the Chair

This is a non-salaried position. The majority of meetings will be held on MS Teams, however, for any face-to-face meetings, all reasonable expenses and travel costs will be met by the RCoA in line with our expenses policy. The tenure of appointment is two years. The chair will have the following responsibilities:

- Chair the EDAG and ensure the effective running of the group activities and governance
- Ensure collaborative working and learning from across examinations and specialties to achieve best practice in examination/assessment practice
- Act as Education, Training and Examinations (ET&E) Board representative on the College Finance and Resources Board
- Maintain regular contact with the Director of Education, Training and Examinations and the Head of Examinations, including briefing meetings with senior officers in the College/ faculties
- Ensure that the voice of doctors in training, candidates, patients, examiners and staff
 are included within the debates, discussions and decisions around examination
 development and piloting.

Application process

All applications will be considered by the three examination boards and the Director of Education, Training and Examinations.

- 1. Relevant knowledge, skills and experience.
- 2. Any projects, initiatives and activities associated to improving medical education and assessment.
- 3. How you will ensure best practice is maintained across our examinations whilst capturing the views of examiners, candidates and Doctors in Training as an integral part of this work.
- 4. How you will ensure commitment to the role.
- 5. Leadership capabilities.
- 6. Availability throughout the course of the year.
