

Theme

You are invited to submit a video for presentation at Anaesthesia 2025, on **20-22 May**. Have you been involved in a project that has had impact in the field of anaesthesia through innovative practices, research or educational initiatives? If so, make a short video to showcase your work and enter this competition for a chance to win a £100 prize.

- The competition is looking for submissions that addresses relevant, timely topics within anaesthesia, with clear application to current clinical practices, emerging technologies, or patient safety improvements.
- Submissions should demonstrate how the work presented has made a measurable, positive impact—whether through enhanced patient outcomes, operational improvements, or the introduction of innovative techniques or technologies that have been successfully implemented.
- The video should clearly illustrate how the initiative has improved anaesthesia care, whether through improved patient safety, streamlined workflows, or educational advancements. It should also provide evidence of sustained or reproducible impact.
- This competition aims to highlight work that not only pushes the boundaries of anaesthesia practice but also tangibly improves the quality and safety of care provided to patients.

Eligibility

The competition is open to all healthcare professionals or student healthcare professionals.

Prize

1st prize: £100 voucher

All accepted videos will be invited to present their poster at the Conference

All accepted videos will also be able to have the abstract published in the British Journal of Anaesthesia Open Access Journal, please see information below for submitting your abstract to them.

- Submit your video via wetransfer or dropbox to events@rcoa.ac.uk along with a signed copy of the form below.
- Please follow the poster preparation guidelines on page 2; failure to follow the guidelines could result in disqualification from the competition.
- Please follow abstract preparation guidelines on page 3 for the submission to the BJA Open Access Journal.

What happens next?

- The closing date for entries will be **23.59 Monday 24 March 2025**.
- A panel of RCoA judges will assess all submissions shortly after the closing date. Authors will be notified by **Monday 14 April** if they have been invited to display their video at Anaesthesia 2025.
- All accepted videos will be invited to showcase their poster on the virtual platform.

Video Preparation Guidelines

Criteria

- **Videos should be a maximum of 3 minutes long**
- Be clear and to the point
- Use slides or images where relevant
- Please do not just read your abstract, use graphics and images to make it more interactive

Technical specifications

We do check all video abstracts for quality, to make sure they are watchable. Below are our technical specifications:

- Format: .mov, .mpg, or .mp4
- Maximum file size: 100 MB
- Aspect ratio: 16:9, square pixels, deinterlaced (landscape format is best)
- Videos must be submitted as a video file or link to the source video - we cannot accept video links to other platforms, i.e. YouTube links

Videos must include:

- acknowledgement of sources of funding
- a content structure that progresses through: title, authors, institution(s), introduction, methods, results, conclusion, acknowledgements and references.
- the following statement (if applicable and true): "This study received ethics committee approval or was conducted under the Animal (Scientific Procedures) Act (1986) (include licence numbers) or equivalent"

Other information:

- the presenting author will receive a certificate of presentation for producing and presenting a video and may be entitled to claim CPD credits internally. You are advised to liaise with your appraiser. For enquiries regarding RCoA CPD accreditation please contact the CPD Coordinator at CPD@rcoa.ac.uk.
- The British Journal of Anaesthesia Open Access Journal will work with us to identify content they wish to publish. For those chosen the publishing fees will be waived. As part of this process, we ask that you submit your work as an abstract to p.m.hopkins@leeds.ac.uk following the instructions below.

If you wish to have an abstract of your poster considered for publication for 2025 you must prepare and submit this according to the following instructions in addition to the submission of the digital copy of your poster.

Abstract preparation:

Abstracts should be prepared as a single page Word file formatted as follows:

- Paper size: A4
- Margins: all set at 2.5 cm
- Font: Times New Roman 12pt
- Line spacing: single

The content should include:

- Title
- Authors
- Author affiliations
- Text: separate paragraphs for Introduction, Methods, Results, Conclusion (for case reports use Introduction, Case details, Conclusion).
- One figure or table may be included but it must be embedded within the single page document. Any figure or table must have a legend/caption
- Reference list formatted as follows: 1st author name, et al. Abbreviated journal title year; volume: page numbers, e.g. Rueffert H, et al. Br J Anaesth 2021;126:120-30.
- Funding – acknowledge any sources of external funding that have supported the work.

Abstract submission (deadline 28 March 2025):

- Please submit abstracts as an email attachment to p.m.hopkins@leeds.ac.uk
- The subject of the email should be "RCoA Conference Abstract Submission [your name]"
- In the body of the email please provide details of any relevant regulatory & governance approvals for publication of your work.
- Please copy (cc) all authors into the email to confirm that they have approved the submission.
